***10,000 Steps:*  
A Profile of Four Squares**

**Oakland, CA:** Pro Arts presents *10,000 Steps: A Profile of Four Squares*, an exhibition of the artist group marksearch's multi-year participatory stewardship project in and around Oakland's historic downtown parks. These parks—Jefferson Square, Lafayette Square, Madison Square, and Lincoln Square, each occupying only one city block—are tiny spots of open space in the urban fabric of downtown, places where tai chi practitioners, men gathering for a pick-up game of basketball, kids in after-school programs, mothers with strollers, and the homeless can all come together. Through a unique style of stewardship, marksearch has been exploring how people understand public space, by making the invisible visible, and in turn by making themselves invisible. In wearing brown overalls and pushing a workcart containing a trash can, brooms, and trowels—which they do use to actually clean the park—marksearch is modeling stewardship and at the same time investigating the parks as outsiders, since they don't live in the neighborhood. They have spoken with everyone: small business owners who have shops facing the park, recreation center directors, long-time residents, the homeless. Working with the neighbors and community groups that surround these parks, marksearch has initiated a series of engaging green art activities including: the creation of a community garden with unique park benches, on-site collection of oral history, and a variety of downtown stewardship performances.

This multimedia installation at Pro Arts will showcase the history of these parks and the diverse communities that surround them through image, text, maps and video. In celebration of the first phase of the *10,000 Steps* project, the exhibit will incorporate an innovative series of events to familiarize the public with the parks and their neighborhoods, including guided walking tours (sponsored by the Oakland Heritage Alliance) and lunchtime demonstrations. *10,000 Steps: A Profile of Four Squares* continues the spirit of recognizing Oakland Parks and Recreation's Centennial Celebration. **marksearch**, an Oakland based wife-husband team (Sue Mark and Bruce Douglas), has been creating community art projects since 2000. In their unique brand of interdisciplinary art, marksearch creates interactive projects inviting people to reflect upon their local communities and increase their awareness of the natural environment within the urban fabric. These ecologically and socially-based projects rely on an accessible format based on daily life. Through the development of kinetic vehicles, traveling signage, unconventional surveys, and official logos, marksearch crafts a much-needed conversational commons. Conversation guides their urban investigations that push the boundaries of how community-based art can influence public policy.
